STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

Background

The Student Information System (SIS) is a database used to communicate student information to parents/guardians and home schools by tracking students' academic achievement, student demographics, individual school information and course registration information. The goal of a SIS is to provide Global Education administrators, teachers and schools with accurate information and securely store student information as per Ministry of Education and Child Care requirements.

Procedures

- Global Education is the primary contact between the home schools for SIS data collection.
- 2. The roles and responsibilities of the Director of Global Education are as follows:
 - 2.1. Ensure Global Education staff and home schools are trained in the procedures for collecting, coding, uploading/downloading and entering required data as per their role description and security access.
 - 2.2. Assist Global Education staff establish and monitor the student data collection process as required by Global Education and the Ministry of Education and Child Care.
 - 2.3. To gather and consolidate student data from all schools.
 - 2.4. To ensure the accuracy and completeness of student data; and,
 - 2.5. To transmit student data to the Ministry of Education and Child Care promptly so as to meet Ministry requirements.
- 3. Global Education must ensure that:
 - 3.1. The collection and recording of all student data is accurate, complete and timely.
 - 3.2. Global Education home schools are provided with accurate, regular and timely student achievement information as per Ministry.
